Continuous provision (CP) refers to the child led opportunities within the setting and will provide opportunities to explore all seven areas of learning - these seven areas are a constant thread through all we do. During CP sessions, adults take on the role of either 'manager' or 'targeter'. The manager is overseeing the children in provision and advancing children's thought processes and learning through discussion and questioning. The targeter is leading learning within the classroom. This targeted learning will focus on different areas of the curriculum each week.
